#### 1. Senior Warden

Greetings to you all as we begin a New Year ~!

As we remain in transition seeking a new Priest for Scott Parish, we were blessed during this past year to have several Supply Priests with us. We began the year with the Rev. Mark Wastler, who served as mid-term Supply from February through early June and who led us through a contemplative Lenten season and a very meaningful Holy Week and Easter Day service. Throughout the year we were also blessed and are grateful for Penn Bowers and Pauline Vismer, our Lay Eucharist Ministers, who led us in Morning Prayer services on several Sundays.

Over the course of the summer of '24 we were fortunate to have our good friend and former Priest-in-Charge, The Rev. Jane Barr, serve in a Supply capacity for several Sundays. In addition, The Rev. Richard Lord and The Rev. Will Dickinson also served with us through the Fall months. The Rev. Jeffrey Fishwick led one service in December as well as our Annual Christmas Eve Service, which is a cherished one we all look forward to in rounding out the year.

Continuing to serve as your Senior Warden during our ongoing transition period has been challenging but has been made easier with all the support and encouragement I have received from our Vestry, our Supply Priests and from all of you in our congregation; for that I am truly grateful. Of course, the most challenging aspect has been and continues to be our search for a new priest. In that regard, our Discernment Committee, chaired by Carolyn Smith, has done exemplary work in jumping through all the hoops required to post a job opening on the Diocesan website. Thankfully, that posting is now on the website and we are prayerful that we will be receiving interested applicants soon.

In the meantime, Christ Church remains active and plays a significant role in all our lives. The varied areas of responsibility essential in sustaining our life in this community include the Altar Guild; Music Department; Outreach; Fellowship & Beautification; Christian Education; Finance and Treasurer; and our physical facilities management. Our Parish Administrator, Cynthia Arnold, serves the essential role of supporting all these areas in the life of our church, and we are grateful for her work and dedication.

Although being sidelined with health issues over the past several months, our dear friend and consummate organist, Tom May, continues working on his recovery process that will bring him back to us and to making our organ 'sing' like no one other than he can do.

As we move forward into this new year, I remain hopeful and optimistic that we are being led forward in all right ways, and I know that we are blessed every step of the way by the Holy Spirit.

#### 2. Junior Warden

The Buildings and Grounds of our church and rectory are in fair condition, and currently are not challenged with significant concerns. Our property continues to have a dynamic list of items which could use attention and can be addressed as time permits.

After many months of sitting empty, our rectory was placed on the market as rental property in March, and within a few days the property was leased on a yearlong contract. The new renter has taken fair accountability for the routine maintenance and is prompt in rent remittance. The shed needs some work, and we are waiting for a convenient time to repair the hole in its roof. One last ongoing project which will be completed in January '25 is the cleaning of the fireplace flues.

As for the church and parish hall, the smaller maintenance items were again handled throughout the year by our membership, which like the rectory, saved us from hiring landscape vendors. (One vendor was hired to perform a deep raking from under the magnolia trees). The removal of the honeybees from the church eaves was completed the previous Spring, although they appear to have come back to the belfry having been spotted in the late Fall. The replacement of the Heating and Cooling systems for the parish hall was completed satisfactorily. The church building AC systems are aged but continue to hold their own and will need replacement, but I recommend we run these to failure, then replace individually. In the Spring, a Va. State compliance inspection of the boiler was performed post maintenance without issue.

As I am being relieved of my warden duties at the start of 2025, any of the concerns I have regarding our physical assets will be discussed with the oncoming warden in detail.

As always, if there are concerns or questions, please feel free to speak your mind.

#### 5. Outreach

Often our neighbors sit on the bench as they eat and ponder the beauty with St. Francis. It has also been an opportunity for our neighbors to be givers as well! Often items are anonymously placed in the box. This is a beautiful silent relationship between Christ Church and our community. Easter Egg Hunt: Christ Church held our annual Easter Egg Hunt ...welcoming neighbors into our churchyard home and sharing the joy of Easter. Over 500 Easter eggs were loaded with candy and hidden! More than 20 children delighted in hunting for eggs. Our church family and our neighbors shared the joy of watching. It was a beautiful Eastertime of fun and fellowship.

Free Children's Book Fair: Thanks to all who made this special event one filled with God's Love for our neighbors from the Summer Child Care Program across the street. Over 35 children were welcomed through open doors into our Parish Hall (which had been transformed into a well-stocked Book Fair). They were so excited to shop for free (beautiful) books. Each child could choose five books for themselves, plus one to give away. They were given a special bag to carry their books home. The bags have our church's picture on them, and each held an inspirational bracelet, a kindness coin (to be passed on with an act of kindness), a "church" bookmark, and a Be Kind pin with Luke 6:31 on it. Some of the children put their pins on right away. (Please see the pictures in the Parish Hall.) The members of our church family who were present shared God's Love (and their love of books and children). The children were so delighted to show us their new books! Planting seeds, my friends, planting seeds!!

4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade: Christ Episcopal Church was a familiar sight during the Gordonsville 4th of July Parade. As God Bless America was displayed and cried out from "our" truck, two of our grandchildren gave out over 200 little God Bless America frisbees to every child they could see along the route! Our neighbors along the route were smiling and waving. Thanks to all!!

Back to School Clothing Drive: In August, we held our back-to-school new-clothing drive to benefit children in grades (K-5) at Gordon Barbour Elementary School. Everyone in our church family was so generous. We were able to provide the school clinic with many new clothes and new shoes for the students. Surely, many children (and their parents) were blessed with this outpouring of God's love.

Gordonsville Chicken Festival: We filled over 50 children's bags with inspirational bracelets, pencils, bookmarks, kindness coins to pass along to another who needed kindness, and Luke 6:31 "Be Kind" pins. Many baked goods were ready to be given away. Unfortunately, the Festival had to be cancelled due to the weather.

**Veteran's Day Parade:** Christ Episcopal Church is a familiar "neighbor" as we participate with our community in this special Gordonsville event to honor our veterans. Our church banner was proudly carried, "our" truck was decorated, and one of our grandchildren passed out "Pray for our Heroes" buttons to those cheering along the parade route. Habitat for Humanity Food Drive for Thanksgiving: Christ Church once again demonstrated God's LOVE in your generous outpouring of monetary donations. 2024 saw an increase of 14% in the number of pledges received.

The church has benefitted from the rental of the rectory for most of the year. This provided an extra \$15,300 in funds.

It was not necessary this year to transfer funds from the Legacy Fund to meet extraordinary expenses.

Looking to the future and the need to hire a new priest the Finance Committee has developed a budget of \$172,000 for 2025.
